## Doctor of Philosophy in Architecture

This program advances critical spatial, humanistic, and social scientific perspectives on the built environment, with focus areas including spatial and environmental justice, urban and architecture history, digital humanities, and community centered methods of research and design.

<p><b>REQUIREMENTS</b></p> <p><b>Residency</b> The minimum required full-time residency for the PhD program in the School of Architecture is two years.</p> <p><b>English Language</b> Demonstrable proficiency in the English language</p> <p><b>Full-time Enrollment</b> Students are required to be enrolled full-time up to the successful completion of the qualifier phase (including all required coursework). <p><b>Year 2 onwards</b></p> <p>Every doctoral student is required to demonstrate ability for research prior to candidacy by completing 48 units minimum of satisfactory independent research.</p> <p><b>Game Plan</b> The game plan specifies the student's area(s) of concentration, reading lists within each area, an abstract of scope of work, and the list of courses taken.
